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NATIONWIDE BOILER HOSTS AMMONIA-FREE CATASTAK-FT SCR SYSTEM OPEN HOUSE

ore than fifty quests representing the food, refining, and district heating industries, including boiler service and equipment providers, attended Nationwide Boiler's Open House in Fremont, CA for the launch of the new Ammonia-Free CataStak™-FT selective catalytic reduction (SCR) system. Despite unfavorable weather conditions, guests gathered into Nationwide's shop facility to view the Ammonia-Free CataStak™-FT mounted on an 800 HP Cleaver-Brooks boiler, firing natural gas at full load conditions. The boiler easily demonstrated 1 ppm NOx emissions with only 0.25 ppm slip.

The innovative Ammonia-Free CataStak™-FT uses a 32% urea commercially solution, called diesel exhaust fluid (DEF). This eliminates the need for end-users to store or handle ammonia, typically requiring a HAZMAT safety program (if stored in volumes exceeding five-hundred pounds).

Components Associates, Inc. (CCA) patented TRIM-NOx™ urea injection system, a proven technology with over ciency savings that the product has one-hundred successful installations.

The TRIM-NOx™ urea injection system is comprised of three primary components: a tank, PLC control panel and two injectors. Precise amounts of urea are injected directly into the exhaust gas of the boiler where the urea decomposes to ammonia (NH3) and reacts with oxides of NOx across catalyst, located downstream of the injection points. The conversion of NOx results in the formation of elemental nitrogen and water, reducing NOx emission levels greater than 90%.

Engineers from both Nationwide Boiler and CCA were in attendance to answer questions relating to the operational and technical characteristics of the SCR system. In addition, a brief presentation of the new technology was presented by Nationwide Executive

The system utilizes the Combustion Vice President, Larry Day, highlighting the safety advantages, emission reduction capabilities and energy effito offer. "We are proud that we can offer a product that not only provides optimal NOx emission control and energy savings, but one that also provides end-users with a low cost SCR option without the use of ammonia."

where winter temperatures are typically over 80°F. However, like so many other cities that experienced unseasonable weather patterns earlier this year, Jal, NM was unable to stay immune from one of the coldest winters on record. The city recorded freezing temperatures of -4°F for the month of February.

Southern Union Gas Services (SUG), a division of Southern Union Company, operates a processing plant located in Jal that produces approximately 300 MMcf/d of natural gas which supplies three pipeline systems in New Mexico. The plant supplies natural gas and natural gas liquids to power generating companies, utilities, energy marketers and industrial users located primarily in the Southwestern U.S.

When temperatures at the Jal plant dropped

below freezing, SUG's boiler experienced critical failure as a result of freeze damage to the boiler con-Bailey Boiler Works (Lubbock, TX) was contacted to assess the damage and repair work. They determined the equipment could not be easily repaired.

In need of an immediate boiler solution, SUG contacted Nationwide Boiler and rented a 60,000 lb/hr trailer-mounted boiler. In less than a week Nationwide had the boiler on-site (shipped from Houston, TX, one of Nationwide's strategic
